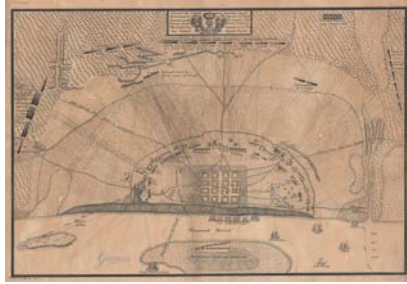


- The historic 1908 Grand Prize of America Automobile racing road course that took place around Savannah and Chatham County, published in 1908
