Dr. W. Todd Groce, president and CEO of the Georgia Historical Society and James H. Blanchard, representing the Georgia Historical Society board of curators, unveiled a new historical marker Tuesday afternoon in the 1300 block of Broadway in Columbus.

The marker commemorates the Civil War Women's Riot from April of 1863, where sixty five Columbus women, armed with pistols and knives, met at the site of the marker before marching down Broad Street and raiding speculator's stores.

The Georgia Historical Society, in partnership with The Georgia Department of Economic Development, unveiled and dedicated the marker during a 3pm ceremony.
