- 1. What years did Margaret Mitchell write Gone with the Wind?
  - Answer: 1926-1936
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer? Margaret Mitchell
- 2. This poet is best known for his works "The Marshes of Glynn" and "Song of the Chattahoochee."
  - Answer: Sidney Lanier
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer? <u>Birthplace of Sidney Lanier</u>; <u>Captain Wylly Road</u>; <u>Lanier's Oak</u>; <u>Sidney Lanier: Georgia's Greatest Poet</u>; or <u>Lanier County</u>
- 3. This Pulitzer Prize nominee and five-time recipient of the Georgia Writer Association's literary achievement award spent most of his life living in Union County.
  - Answer: Byron Herbert Reece
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: **Byron Herbert Reece**
- 4. Dr. William Caruthers authored this book in 1841, one of the earliest novels published in book form in Georgia.
  - Answer: The Knights of the Golden Horse-Shoe
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: <u>Dr. Wm. A. Caruthers</u> (1802-1846): Early American Novelist
- 5. Governor Jimmy Carter appointed this person the Poet Laureate of Georgia in 1973.
  - Answer: Conrad Aiken
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: Conrad Aiken
- 6. Who was the first Georgia novelist to be awarded the Pulitzer Prize for Literature? For what novel?
  - Answer: Caroline Pafford Miller; Lamb in His Bosom
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: <u>Pulitzer Prize Winner</u> Caroline Pafford Miller
- 7. This person is considered Georgia's "lost poet," and is said to have influenced the works of Edgar Allen Poe.
  - Answer: Dr. Thomas Holley Chivers
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: <u>Site of Chivers Plantation</u> and Store
- 8. Widely known for his role as a newspaper publisher and the first vice-president of the Republic of Texas, this person also published *Verse Memorials*, a volume of poetry.
  - Answer: Mirabeau Buonaparte Lamar
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: <u>Mirabeau Buonaparte</u> Lamar

- 9. This author compiled and published Uncle Remus tales, based on African-American folk lore, and served as associate editor of both the Savannah Morning News and Atlanta Constitution.
  - Answer: Joel Chandler Harris
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: <u>Joel Chandler Harris in</u> Savannah or The Wren's Nest: Home of Joel Chandler Harris
- 10. Born in Savannah, this writer moved to her family's farm in Milledgeville where she published two novels and two collections of short stories.
  - Answer: Flannery O'Connor
  - Which marker did you use to find the answer: Flannery O'Connor's Andalusia Farm
